rom the Board

It was another record year for snowfall. The state of Virginia and all municipalities had enormous expenses for snow removal. Homeowner Associations including the LMROA were not exempt.

While we have had record spring rains, the result is the landscaping has never looked better! The pool and pool area looks great and the pergola at the pool has been given a fresh coat of paint. Our recreational areas are in some of the best shape ever.

Financial

The yearly operating budget has been developed and the monthly owner's assessment had only a marginal increase. This is primarily due to garbage pick-up, landscape maintenance, the Association's liability insurance and pool management contract renewals which will all occur at some point during this year. On average vendors are looking for a three percent increase. Complete details on the Fiscal Year 2017 budget were mailed to you on June 1, 2016. In addition, in negotiations with the Master Association member (LMA), strict adherence to the LMA declarations will be used in the future and will result in our percentage contributions going down in the future.

Budget Committee

The Budget Committee spent time consulting with the Board and has been involved in contract and budget development. In addition, a new Reserve Study has been contracted and will be complete for implementation in the next Fiscal Year.

Stonewall Entrance and Community Safety

Our entry system and cameras are currently functioning as designed, enabling the Association to collect damages from residents, visitors and vendors who cause damage to our gates.

Board Member, Joe Greenlee and Security Committee Chairman, Rowland Bowers, assisted by Brian Lilly of Dewberry Consultants, submitted the proposed third-lane plans designed by Gate Logic for the Stonewall Entrance to Prince William County for approval.

Swim and Tennis Areas

In preparation for pool opening several pool lights were replaced, the pergola had some repairs and paint and some minor concrete and brick point up were done on the pool deck. The pool should be ready to handle the summer heat and community activities.

Turtle Point Townhomes

Basheer & Edgemoore is beginning construction of three additional units in June. While sales have been less than forecasted, they are confident they will continue to sell units and be successful as the real estate market and economy moves forward. They are committed to develop the area as planned with high end townhomes in support of Lake Manassas standards.

Please take the time to read all of the committee reports in this edition of The Lake Manassas Connection for an update of the hard work selflessly performed by your fellow residents.

Hello Summer! It seems like we went from cold and rainy to the heat of summer overnight. I hope you have the opportunity to enjoy the facilities at the Swim and Tennis Center and cool off at the pool this summer. Enjoy!

Pool Hours

The pool is open daily from 11 a.m. until 8 p.m. and will close for the season at 8 p.m. on Monday, September 5^{th} (Labor Day).

There are four swim meets this summer (*Go Blue Dolphins!*) and on those days the pool will open at 1:00. The Swim Team also uses the pool for practice in the morning (before opening to residents) and again in the evenings (pool remains open for resident use) during which time one lane is reserved for resident use.

Covenants and Inspections

Comprehensive inspections are underway. If you receive a notice regarding a violation – whether it be a friendly reminder or violation letter - please work as quickly as possible to resolve the issue so that additional letters/measures by the Covenants Committee do not become necessary. Lake Manassas is a beautiful community and ensuring that the covenants are enforced keeps the community looking good and helps protect your property values.

Courteous Neighbors

Please do not walk on private property which includes residents' lawns and the golf course. Please keep children and animals off the golf course. Golfers retrieving golf balls are allowed to walk in the resident's yards that back up on the golf course.

Although on street parking is not permitted in Lake Manassas, we do understand there are occasions when temporary parking on the street may be necessary, for example, children's birthday parties and holiday dinners. Please make every effort to have your guests park in your empty driveway spaces first.

Noise Ordinance Times: The Prince William County noise ordinance is Monday through Friday from 10 pm until 6 am and on Saturday, Sunday and Holidays from 10 pm until 9 am. If you were to contact the police regarding what you consider to be an inappropriate time for unusually loud noises, they will come out and investigate. But first, speak to your neighbors to explain that the noise is disturbing to you.

Complaints: The onsite office regularly receives complaints on a variety of topics that most recently include:

- $\bullet \quad \text{Cigarette butts disposed of improperly on the street and/or on private property};\\$
- Dogs barking and biting; Pets off leash and/or roaming and defecating on private property;
- Neighbor's lawns not mowed or weeded properly;
- Speeding;
- Vehicles running stop signs;
- RV's and/or boats brought into the community and left overnight and/ or parked in dangerously in the street.

Management will address these issues as they arise, however some issues are best resolved neighbor to neighbor. We thank you in advance for following the County laws as well as the community rules and being a considerate neighbor.



Sudget & Finance

Since our last input to the Lake Manassas Connection we have been busy reviewing landscape contract proposals and working on a review of the FY 2016-17 budget. Our review of the combined LMA and LMROA landscaping contract proposals led to a re-pricing of the homeowners portion resulting in significant savings. We have made a number of recommendations to the board on the FY 2016-17 budget and await the final Board action and approval of the association budget. Contracts that will be coming up for renewal in the next year include Trash Collection, Security, and Pool management. Also we will be looking at the soon to be completed Reserve Study to ensure the community is properly capitalized for future maintenance and repair needs.

Meetings as required will generally be held on the 3rd or 4th Thursday of the month at 5PM at the on-site management office. Community ecurity & isitor Access Report

The Community Security and Visitor Access Committee is pleased that our gate attendants are able to monitor activities at the Swim and Tennis facility -- especially in the evening -- and provide necessary information to Prince William County police when needed. In addition, the video surveillance cameras have been effective in identifying vehicles that have caused damage to our gates; this has been helpful in enabling us to pursue those responsible for the cost of repairs. As a note of caution, if you drive an oversized SUV or truck, please remember to come to a complete stop and watch then wait for both the iron gates to open (in the evening) and barrier to raise up before proceeding.

We appreciate the number of residents who have properly registered their vehicles with us. If you recently received a letter from management regarding the issuance of vehicle decals, please follow up with the site manager so that decals can be assigned to you. These decals are to appropriately identify residents who live in the community – it is a security issue.

At this writing, specific details are unavailable regarding the recent accident at Lake Manassas Drive and Route 29, which resulted in a fatality. We urge all residents to enter and exit the community at Baltusrol Drive or at the Shops at Lake Manassas; if you choose to enter or exit from Lake Manassas Drive, please exercise the utmost caution.

- Managing the overall operation of the new LMROA web site and work with the contractor to
 ensure that the web site is user friendly and serves the best interest of the community.
- Providing the BOD with recommendations for improving the community's image through the
 development of a welcome package; highlighting the community's positive features, which could
 be made available to current community homeowners, and potential new residents.

NOTE: The Communications Committee has attempted to assign each of its five members with specific tasks to ensure activity progress and accountability. This concept appears to be working well.

The Focus of the Communications Committee for this reporting period has been/continues to be:

• Development of a new LMROA web site. As reported earlier, the current web site does not belong to the LMROA, is not user friendly and lacks an updated "address book."

Excellent progress continues to be made with the development of the new web site. It is anticipated that with continued development, testing, promoting the web site and educating the LMROA residents.... the web site will be operational in the Fall

- Promote other LMROA Committee activities. One of the Communications Committee goals is to
 assist other LMROA committees in promoting their activities. A major step forward in this process
 is to meet with Committee Chairs quarterly, sponsored by the LMROA BOD. Our first meeting is
 pending.
- Review the LMROA Welcome Package. The existing "Welcome Package" has been reviewed. Appropriate changes have been made and a revised "Welcome Package" is being developed.
- Develop a program to recognize volunteers who serve on Committees and/or are active on activities that serve the Lake Manassas Community. This activity is under development and a plan of action will be included in a later edition of the Lake Manassas Connection.
- Establishing an electronic bulletin board system to replace the existing bulletin boards and to better
 inform the LMROA community of current activities. As of this writing, the Communications
 Committee is awaiting BOD funding approval for this project.

Covenants Report

Annual Inspection:

The comprehensive annual inspection is underway. This inspection looks at all aspects of the property including aesthetics to determine if modifications to the property have been completed in accordance with an approved application. If violations are found a notice is mailed to the homeowner providing them the opportunity to correct the cited violations, and providing a cure period in which to do so. If a homeowner is not sure what the notice is requesting they should contact the on-site Covenants Administrator for assistance. Written requests for extensions to the cure period will be reviewed on a case by case basis. Properties are inspected again at the end of the cure period and violations are closed for those homeowners who resolve them; homeowners who fail to cure the violations are referred to the Covenants Committee for review.

Yard Maintenance:

Summer heat can take a toll on your lawn. If you mow too low, water too much/too little, or ignore early signs of problems, your grass can become lackluster or die in small or large patches. The experts offer the following summer care tips.

- Mow at the right height: Leave your grass taller, it shades soil which reduces water evaporation, leads to deeper roots and prevents weed seeds from germinating. When mowing never remove more than one-third of the leaf surface at a time.
- ✓ Water properly: For the healthiest grass water your lawn deeply and infrequently.
- ✓ **Treat for grubs:** Japanese beetles/June bugs/European chafers lay eggs in grass in early to midsummer and hatch into grubs in mid-to-late summer.
- Sharpen your mower blade: A dull mower blade tears grass, creating ragged, brown edges that provide an opening for disease organisms. The rule of thumb is that a blade lasts for 10 hours of mowing.
- Let clippings lie: If you're mowing grass at the right height, you can let clippings lie on the lawn (grass cycling) saving you time/money/fertilizer.
- Fertilize warm-season grasses: Warm-season grasses (bahia, bermuda, centipede, zoysia) need nutrients. They do most of their growing in the summer when temperatures are between 75-90 degrees. In the fall they go dormant, turn brown, and won't green up again until spring. Do not fertilize cool-season lawns during summer, wait until fall/early spring.
- **Pick up litter:** Summer activities can result in toys/water games/lawn chairs/tools being left on the lawn. Avoid harming or killing grass crowns by putting stuff away after use.
- ✓ Tackle weeds: Deal with weeds as they appear throughout the growing season. Apply weed control in late summer/early fall to help deal with cool-season weeds, especially if you have established dandelion or perennial weed problems. Do not apply a pre-emergent herbicide in fall if you plan to seed/over seed.

Yard Clippings:

Now that grass is being cut regularly and shrubs are being trimmed, please remember that yard clippings can be set out on the curb no sooner than the evening before collection (this includes clippings left by a landscaping company). Unfortunately, a number of residents are setting clippings out Friday, Saturday and early on Sunday in anticipation of Monday's trash collection. This is a major covenants initiative this summer, none of us want the beauty of the community littered with bags of clippings setting on the curbs days before they are scheduled to be collected (clipping and lawn debris are picked up on Thursday). If for any reason clippings are not collected on a scheduled trash collection day they need to be removed from the curb until the next scheduled collection day (the same restrictions apply to trash and recycling).

Please remember the intent of the covenants process is to maintain the standards of the community so residents can enjoy the beauty and benefit from improved property values.

The meetings are scheduled for the second Monday of the month at 5 pm, but check the calendar for any change. The application is available at the community website as well as at the onsite office. Michelle can assist you with any questions you may have with the process.

Pool Preparations

In preparation for pool opening, the pool deck and furniture have been power washed and the pergola has been cleaned up and painted. We have ordered a new freezer for the life guard office and hope to be able to provide frozen confections for sale soon.

Lighting

The Swim and Tennis Committee will be presenting some ideas to the board for possible replacement of some lights that are in disrepair at the recreation facility. Specifically these are the bollard lights along the sidewalk leading to the tennis and basketball courts. Our electrician finished installing some new interior pool lights and we are happy to report that all lights in the pool and on the pool deck are now working.

Epic Tomatoes -Tips from the Tomatoman

Who doesn't love a ripe, juicy tomato right off the vine? For Craig LeHoullier, author and amateur horticulturist, the quest for the perfect tomato is not just passion; it's obsession. The 'NC Tomatoman,' as he's affectionately known, spent more than 30 years selecting, growing and breeding the most flavorful, disease-resistant tomatoes from his Raleigh, N.C. home, and he's happy to share his top tips.

First, start with healthy seedlings and keep them that way. Apply a layer of mulch to prevent soil, which can carry pathogens, from splashing onto lower leaves, and give plants plenty of room so that the sun and breezes can keep foliage dry.

Don't bother pruning those little side shoots, or "suckers," that grow on the main plant, says LeHoullier. Suckers won't sap energy from the main plant, or prevent fruiting or ripening. If you're growing a determinate or dwarf variety, which grows to a predetermined size, leave it alone. Indeterminate tomatoes, which keep growing, can be topped off to keep them in check. And do make sure you know which type you're buying before you bring them home!

LeHoullier's passion is the new dwarf tomato varieties that combine the convenience of a small compact plant with the flavor of heirlooms. Now, he says, anyone can grow great tomatoes, and they

can do it anywhere. LeHoullier stopped planting tomatoes in his garden years ago, instead growing literally hundreds at a time in grow bags in his driveway. All you need, he says, is a sunny spot and a five-gallon container. Add a support, good quality soil from the garden center, and a little compost and you're good to go.

"For me," says LeHoullier, "anyone who has a few hours of direct sun can grow a few tomato plants. A Sun Gold cherry tomato in every yard would make for a happier country!"



Jummer Gardening Tips

Summer is finally here and so is one of the best times of year to enjoy beautiful lawns and landscapes. The hard work you put in during the Spring can be realized during the carefree months of summer. But ut you still have to keep up with your lawn and plants to make sure they look good all summer and into the fall which is why we supplied this article.

WEEDS: The beds that looked so good with new mulch are probably growing weeds now and they have to be kept under control.



If the weeds are far enough away from your plants and flowers consider spraying them. Herbicides like *Roundup* are a good option as well. Just make sure to read the label and follow directions and recommended safety precautions. Note that you can't expect instantaneous results with sprays so if you want your property to look great immediately considering pulling them.

Weeds in the lawn can also be a huge issue. Even if you used a pre-emergent herbicide in spring, pre-emergents target primarily grassy weeds and aren't as effective against broadleaf weeds like clover, black medic and dandelions. There are lawn fertilizers available that include post-emergent herbicides to kill weeds, but spot spraying with liquid herbicides is likely better. Use caution on these products. Ask for advice and read the labels carefully.

INSECTS: Summer is also an important time to check your

plants for insect activity. Common pests include bagworms, aphids, Japanese beetles and such. Identifying pests and the right treatment is really difficult but the sooner you deal with the issue, obviously the better chance your plants and flowers will have. Be vigilant here.

Be sure to keep standing away from your home or where you will be sitting, or children playing. It attracts mosquitos and with ZIKA concerns it's vital you take precautions.

WATERING is vital. It is wise to monitor rainfall with a rain gauge. The average plant needs about an inch of water a week. Dig down a few inches into the dirt around your plants. If you come up with dust, they're not getting enough water.

Less frequent watering for longer durations is best. Don't rely on the sprinkler you're using for your lawn to water your trees and shrubs. Their needs are different, and you're better off watering them with a drip line or by hand. Water



landscape plants slowly and soak the root system once or twice a week, depending on rainfall.

NEW AND DORMANT LAWNS


have a tendency to turn brown quickly - as they don't have the route system of older lawns. If your lawn turns brown it is not necessarily dead - feed it with water.

Minimize foot traffic on dormant lawns. If you need to mow a largely dormant lawn because of patchy tall grass or weeds, keep the blades set high. Cutting grass too short when it is already heat or drought stressed

can be a death sentence for turf.

While late winter remains the best time for major pruning, it is fine to do light pruning in summer to eliminate dead and crossing branches, improve access to sidewalks, doors or hose bibs or to generally control growth.


And finally, now is the best time to consider future projects. If you're planning to do a major landscape renovation that includes a patio or any element of hardscaping, it's a good idea to get that part of the job done before fall. Hardscape projects can take a long time, and the window of opportunity for fall planting is narrow. If you head into the fall with that patio, walkway or retaining wall already in place, getting the plants in around it will be much less stressful. Early fall is also usually a good time to get a good deal financially when landscapers are shower. And you need time to get approval from Covenants.





Mosquitoes in Virginia


According to Alison Ansher MD, MPH, who is the Director of the Prince William Health District, "the Asian Tiger mosquito is the most common cause of daytime biting mosquitos in the Prince William Health District (PWHD), and is one of the mosquitos that transmits the Zika virus. As opposed to other mosquitoes in Prince William County, the Asian Tiger flies and bites during daylight hours and will enter homes through any open door or window and bite inside the home. These mosquitoes are also different from other species because they lay their eggs exclusively in containers holding a small amount of water (i.e. old tires, bottle caps, bird baths gutters and tarps) and they do not lay their eggs in 'ground' bodies of water such as puddles, flooded ditches, ponds or streams. Consequently, these mosquitos tend to breed close to where residents live, walk and play."

of Health on eliminating mosquito breeding sites include:

- Clean out leaves and debris from roof, gutters, corrugated pipes for downspout drainage;
- Store or turn over wheelbarrows, buckets, watering cans or anything else that holds water; drill holes in the bottom of containers/planters and empty saucers at least once a week;
- At least weekly, change water and keep bird baths clean;
- Filter/aerate the water and recirculation pump in ornamental ponds or treat with larvicide.
- Repair dripping outdoor faucets;
- Store children's toys (wagons, kiddie pools, watering cans, etc.) indoors;
- Straighten tarps or grill covers and empty water from sagging area on these covers:

Have you ever considered skydiving? If you have already experienced it - was it indoors or out? Now you can do it indoors, locally at One Loudoun - I-Fly, or "for real" out of Warrenton. Following is a sampling of what you can expect from both.



Indoor Skydiving - what's to expect when you go to the new indoor Skydiving Center - I-Fly at One Loudoun and in Virginia Beach

They welcome flyers from 3 to 103 with some health restrictions, however the weight limit is 250.

At iFLY you will experience the feeling of freefall as you float on a smooth cushion of air. There are no parachutes, no jumping, and nothing attaching you to planet earth. It's just you, flying in the air.

Here's what you can expect:

FLIGHT TRAINING: The certified flight instructor assigned to your class will find you in the viewing area and guide you to the classroom for flight training instruction. During training you will learn the proper body position for flying and hand signals the instructors will use while you are flying.

GEAR UP: After flight training, your instructor will take you to the gear-up counter where you will receive your helmet, flight suit and googles.

FLYING: Your instructor will lead you to the flight chamber and will be with you during the entire flight experience, helping you enter the flight chamber (just lean in) and spotting you the entire time, to help you fly like a superhero.

POST-FLIGHT: Your instructor will lead you out of the flight chamber, you will de-gear and receive your personalized flight certificate. Pictures and videos of your flight will be available for purchase at kiosks near the gear counter.

The entire iFLY experience lasts about 1.5 hours and each flight is the equivalent of 1.5 skydives.

The sport of indoor skydiving is accomplished using modern wind tunnels which give skydivers a consistent and practical way to develop and hone skills that usually require jumping from a plane. Additionally, the increase in availability of wind tunnels has created a whole new genre of sport called bodyflight.

If you have an interest in pursuing bodyflight as a sport, instructors can design a training program to help you progress in your flying skills. iFLY also offers opportunities to get involved in local flight training nights that allow you to meet other participants and build your skills. You can compete in a local competition that may include freestyle and formation flying. To find out more about the world of bodyflight including news, competitions and flying technique videos, visit the International Bodyflight Association (IBA) website.

The more you fly, the better you will become. Dedicated iFLY instructors can help you progress faster, teach you new techniques and give you in-flight challenges to complete. Every coaching session comes with a pre-flight gameplan and post-flight debrief to review your progress with the instructor and to chart a course of action for taking your skills to the next level.

THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT SKY DIVING with the DC Skydiving Center in Warrenton.

It generally takes 2 hours to complete a class and make your first jump.

Before you jump, you will be given approximately 30 minutes of instruction.

Following your class, your instructor will help you gear up and safely board the plane by walking behind the plane and away from the propellers.

The door opens around 10,000' and you hear "READY, SET, GO!!!" Remember to smile for your 120 mph, 40 second freefall video!

When your parachute opens, you will feel the wind stop and peacefully float down from 5000'. Your parachute ride lasts about 7 minutes.

Tandem sky diving means you are harnessed to a certified sky dive instructor and you jump together. There are many ways to jump, however - in a group, one your own and so on. You can get certified. The Accelerated Freefall Program (AFP) prepares you for your first solo dive.

Advanced divers can practice belly flying, freeflying (vertical flying), sky-boarding and even the new birdman suit.

Pricing starts at about \$ 200. There are also student and military discounts offered. Photos and videos are pricing add ons.

TROLLEY PUB CRAWL







Lake Manassas Community Information

COMMUNITY SAFETY:

Please drive slowly and use caution as you drive through the community keeping an eye out for pedestrians and children. Observe yield, stop and speed limit signs; remind your children about the dangers of running and playing in the street and ask them to move out of the way of approaching vehicles

Prince William County Police are making more frequent random visits within Lake Manassas and will take appropriate action to address speeding, running stop signs, use of unauthorized motorized vehicles and vandalism. Please obey stop signs and yield signs while driving in the community. There have been reports of near misses at the Spyglass Hill Loop circle due to driver's inattention to signs and approaching vehicles as well as damage to the common area due to speed and inattentive driving. To supplement regular police patrols, the Board is utilizing the County's Off Duty Police Patrol Program to patrol our streets, which is a "pay for" service. Please obey the laws of the road. Passing a stopped school bus constitutes reckless driving in Virginia and is punishable by up to 12 months in jail and/or a fine of up to \$2,500. We also ask that all residents report any suspicious activity to either the police or the management office depending on the time and nature of said activity. Let's all be on the lookout and keep Lake Manassas safe. Please contact gate attendants prior your guests arrival. To secure a temporary parking pass contact the on-site manager. If you or your guests park a vehicle in the street without notice having been given to the onsite manager, the vehicle will likely be issued a warning notice on the windshield. The vehicle information is then forwarded to the onsite office and a violation letter is issued to the owner or owner sponsoring the guest vehicle in question. Violations may result in fines of \$50 for each occurrence. For more specific information regarding parking, please visit the Lake Manassas website at www.lakemanassasroa.com and review the Parking Resolution.

VEHICLE DECALS

Reminder letters on registering vehicles have been sent to those residents who still have not registered and picked up their 2016-17 decals. We are making some headway in the distribution of 2016-17 vehicle decals but there are still a large number of residents who have not submitted registration forms for the new decal. Current decals are to appropriately identify residents who live in the community - it is a security issue. If you haven't obtained your new decal you are strongly encouraged to complete the attached registration form and drop it off with one of our gate attendants or bring it to the Onsite Office at the Swim and Tennis Center where you can pick up your new decals or leave it in our after-hours drop box. Gate attendants have been instructed to stop and record any vehicle that does not display a current vehicle decal. Please register your vehicle as soon as possible to avoid any delay in entering the community.

SECURITY PATROLS:

There have been reports of children running on the golf course, knocking on windows and ringing doorbells of our residents. While this may seem like harmless fun, it is upsetting and disturbing to our residents. The authorities have been notified of these incidents and PWC police and our off duty patrols will keep a watchful eye out for any suspicious persons and activity and necessary action against trespassing will be taken.

STREET PARKING:

We understand that over the holidays, or when you are receiving guests, parking in the street may be necessary. It seems, however, that the issue of vehicles parked in the street on a regular basis is becoming a problem.

When you moved to the community you were provided with documents containing the covenants, conditions and restrictions for the LMROA. The guidelines state that there is no street parking permitted without prior authorization of management. If you have room in your driveway then you should not have cars parked in the street. Understandably, for those who have multiple vehicles, rearranging cars to accommodate those who live in your home can be a nuisance, however, the parking rule was put in place to keep as many vehicles as possible off the roads for the safety and aesthetics of the community. If you or your guests require tempo-

rary street parking, please contact the site office for an approved parking pass. If you continually disregard the parking regulations, you may be called to a hearing before the Covenants Committee and fined for each infraction.

COVENANTS INSPECTIONS:

While we understand that there are certain aspects of property maintenance, that cannot be attended to during certain times of the year, and in certain weather conditions, please do your best to keep your property maintained according to LMROA guidelines. If you are issued a violation notice and need an extension of time to complete repairs, please contact the Covenants Administrator, Sheila Parker at the onsite office by calling 703.753 .7745 or by email at sparker@cmcmanagement.com.

The LMROA Community Handbook contains useful information covering Design Guidelines, Use Restrictions, Property Maintenance Standards and Enforcement Procedures. Please be sure to correct any violations that may exist on your property. If you need a copy of the most current Lake Manassas Handbook, please let us know and we will provide a copy to you at your request. Following are just a sample of a few important inspection items that need to be continuously maintained:

Mailboxes. Approved box color for the old style mailbox is hunter green and the post color is Duron Latex Oyster White. If you need to replace your mailbox, contact Main Street Mailboxes at 703.753.5521. Please feel free to call the on-site management office with any questions at 703.753.7745.

Yards and Lawns. Lawn maintenance items such as weed/crab grass control, dead trees and shrubs and edging as well as replenishing the mulch in your beds need to be continued throughout the year. Please do not leave grass clippings on the sidewalk and/or street.

Home Exteriors. Please look at your home and inspect for peeling and blistering paint and rotted wood, staining and green algae. Please power wash and repaint all affected surfaces. Play equipment. Out-

door play equipment must be approved by the Modifications and Construction Committee. Please obtain your approval before making any purchases. Remember, maintaining your property on a regular basis not only ensures that the standards of the community are preserved, but eliminates the need for violation notices, hearings and possible fines.

LEASING A COMMUNITY PROPERTY:

All leases must be minimally 12 months in duration. A copy of the lease must be submitted to the management office before the tenant moves in. Without a copy of the lease, your tenants will not be issued vehicle decals, transponders or pool passes. Please have your tenants stop by the onsite office to pick up a copy of the Lake Manassas Homeowners Handbook and Welcome Package. Remember, tenants are subject to the same residential requirements as all homeowners however, you as the owner, are still responsible for your property. LMROA will contact you as the homeowner for any reconciliation, as needed.

TRASH REMOVAL:

Our trash removal service is provided by American Disposal. Trash is collected weekly on Mondays and Thursdays, with recycling on Mondays and yard debris removal on Thursdays. A special pick up service is available for a fee (white goods, construction debris, etc.), but must be scheduled in advance. Please call American Disposal 703.368.0500 for details and scheduling.

Reminder: Please be sure not to set your trash out any sooner than the evening before collection (approximately 6 pm); trash cans and containers must be stored out of sight prior to sunrise the day after collection. This includes trash left by a landscaping company. When trash is put out a day or two before pickup, the overall effect presents an unsightly appearance in our lovely neighborhood. On windy days, trash is easily blown down the street making the street and the community a mess. Be a good neighbor and tie it down and please be sure to cover all trash.

PETS:

There have been various reports of pets that are allowed to roam without a leash, urinate and defecate on private property and been aggressive toward people and other residents pets. If you experience difficulty with a neighbors pet, you should speak to the neighbor about your concerns. If you feel you need to contact the authorities you can call Prince William County Animal Control. After those options have been exhausted you may contact the onsite office and we will send a reminder of the Prince William County leash law and community guidelines for pets. Pets should not be allowed outside a confined area on your property without being controlled on a leash.


Please try to control your dog from barking excessively especially during the early morning and late evening hours. The on-site office regularly receives complaints regarding pets on private property. Always have your dogs leashed and do not let your cats roam the community.
