

esident Spotlight Around the World in 161 Days

So, how did this crazy idea evolve? A perfect alignment of life's events occurred to create the concept of our trip around the world. First, retirement happened. Second, we had more than enough frequent flier miles. Third, we both had a love of travel. And the fourth major contributor was a sudden plethora of leisure time.

I've been asked many times, "How do you plan such an adventure"? "Well, very carefully", I'd say. We started by thinking of our personal bucket list. We included visits to places that would satisfy our love of nature and photography (i.e. mountain gorillas of Uganda) with other destinations that offered cultural opportunities (ex. China and India). We chose some locations like Mongolia, because its capital, Ulaanbaatar, sounded so exotic. Next, we made our chosen geographical locations into a realistic sequence of destination airports. Then, we decided how long we would need in each location by studying and researching itineraries for those destinations. Finally, 335 days before the last international flight we would take, we made our airline reservations.

Now, it was time to break the journey down into actual segments by location, decide on specifics of what to see and do, determine how long we needed to accomplish our objectives, and book tours, hotels and local airline tickets. Without the internet and PWC library, this would have been 'mission impossible'. Dave took care of booking hotels and airline tickets (for local intra-country travel). Renee worked out the tour itineraries, booked those, and coordinated visas. One restriction we agreed upon up front was "no bus tours". Where a tour was involved, it would include us, a car, driver and guide. One internet site that was particularly helpful to us was tripadvisor.com, a site where reviews are written by people who have actually stayed in the hotels and used the tour operators in each locale. Another helpful site was kayak.com which gave helpful info about which airlines flew to what destinations.

The Trip

Brazil's Pantanal, Our First Destination, July 2011

Being a National Geographic junky, I'd seen two documentaries on an area called the Pantanal, one with a professional nature photographer who toured and photographed the area. The big advantage to the Pantanal was the fact that it contained hundreds of bird species, most if not all of the animals that the Amazon had to offer and enjoyed the advantage of being an immense, open grassy wetland, so the fauna of the region is visible for photography rather than being hidden between and among trees and vegetation, as it is in the rain forest.

We booked an indigenous Brazilian guide who collected us from the airport in his rather dilapidated Toyota jeep named "Bronco Mule," strapped our bags to the roof of the vehicle, and away we went. We drove the Transpantaneira Highway, an unpaved, bumpy, dusty road that transects the Pantanal. We spent a little more than a week there, stopping and staying at lodges along the road that offered slightly different habitats to maximize bird and other wildlife viewing while hiking and driving.

There are no words to describe the diversity of wildlife in the Pantanal, but I'll try. There are huge numbers and species of birds, water birds and raptors. The rock star of the bird world here is the jabiru stork. It's over 4 feet tall. Birds found nowhere else exist here, such as the beautiful and magnificent hyacinth macaw, purplish-blue like the flower. As we drove the highway, many of the birds and some animals appeared: first, hawks, then herons, egrets, jabirus and caimans, to name a few. On one photo stop, the caimans were so thick; they looked like a caiman carpet. Anteaters, coati mundis, agoutis, tapirs, capybaras, caimans and the elusive jaguar all make this place their home.


Summer Pittman

Summer Pittman has lived in Lake Manassas since 1999. She sings, plays guitar, and piano.







Would you spend \$10 to \$20 to keep your furnishings, floor coverings and keepsakes intact?

Consider spending that money on new washing machine hoses, and you may be able to save yourself from a lot of inconvenience, mess and the loss of items that could never be replaced.

Washing machine hose failures cause as much as \$150 million in damage each year to homes in the United States and Canada. But by taking a few precautions, you can greatly reduce your chances of getting soaked by a leaky washing machine hose.

INSPECT THOSE HOSES - Make it a point to periodically inspect your washing machine hoses for signs of wear and tear. Look for bubbles, cracks or fraying. If you see any of these signs, turn off the water supply to your washer and replace the hoses.

YOU CAN REPLACE THEM YOURSELF - Replacing washing machine hoses is as easy as hooking up a water hose to a water spigot. And a new set of hoses costs between \$10 and \$20 at most home repair, hardware and plumbing supply outlets.

To install new hoses, first shut off the water supply to your washing machine. Close the main shutoff valve in your house if a valve closer to your washing machine is not available. Unscrew the old hoses one at a time, draining any water into the washing machine.

Carefully line up the threads and screw the hoses on tightly. Once you've installed the new hoses, open the shutoff valves slowly. Run the machine through a cycle and check carefully for leaks.

Carefully move the washer back toward the wall, keeping the hose free from kinks or tight bends. Allow at least four inches or 11 centimeters between the water connection and the back of your washer.

The Power of Paint



G ardening

In spring we are all chomping at the bit to getting our yards in shape for the coming growing season. The usual areas are raking the leaves, cleaning out the flower beds, mulching, pruning the shrubs, trees and roses, planting flowers, etc.. There are also some additional things you can do to get a running start.

LAWN CARE:

Prior to going out and purchasing fertilizer and lime, it is highly recommended that a soil sample be taken to see what nutrients are needed. Just applying fertilizers without diagnosing the need for them can be a waste of money, could cause damage and the worse case pollute the water supply by adding unnecessary nutrients that can run off into the storm sewer and pollute our watersheds. Soil sample kits can be obtained at the Prince William County Virginia Cooperative extension office. The office is located at 8033 Ashton Ave., Suite 105, Manassas, VA. The phone number is 703.792.4630.

For those who do not plan to seed this spring but would like to get ahead of the weeds including crab grass, it is recommended that a pre-emergent be applied to the lawn. This will inhibit weed growth by halting germination.

Another application is one that kills grubs, ensuring they do not eat your grass roots. A good grub control applied in early spring will benefit your lawn and



For lawn care equipment it is a good time to make sure you lawnmower is in good working order. Replacing worn out blades or sharpening the ones on the mower is essential for good lawn care.

ern States and Meadows Farms.

PRUNING:

A good time to prune your roses is usually after the fifteenth of March. When you complete the pruning it is recommended that at the site of the cuttings you coat the cut with Elmer's wood glue. This is an added protection against borer infecting your rose bushes. Also fertilizing your roses with a specific rose fertilizer will get them off to a great start.

Other pruning chores can be started now especially for sculpting those Crepe Myrtle trees. Some of you who have Hydrangeas should wait until after they bloom to prune since flowering will occur on last year's old wood growth. Cutting them back now could impact flowering this growing season.

The last tip is for those who have an annual problem with bag worms on their trees especially the Leland Cypress and the Arborvitae. Spraying them with an insecticide in early May will definitely stop them from damaging your trees. Simply mist the trees with a chemical name Asephate and reapply in about 15



Lastly, if you have any questions concerning your plants you can contact the Prince William County Master Gardener Horticultural Help Desk which is available five days a week. The number for the Help Desk is 703.792.7747.

Ground Hogs

... the frustration and potential solution

Bring up pesty neighbors in Lake Manassas and undoubtedly you will hear stories about groundhogs, also known as woodchucks, as well as deer and rabbits.

Are you having an issue with one/some? My own personal groundhog has a personality much like the little guy featured in the movie "Caddy Shack." He seems to anticipate my every move and knows how to get around my actions.

I'm told there is no foolproof way to rid yourself of these pest but the following may prove to be helpful:

- Search for an organic, anti-groundhog product created for plants on sale on the internet and at local nurseries. (The products are also available for rabbits and deer). I purchased one for under \$20. Mist your flowers and saturate the surrounding earth and rocks. Each application is supposed to last about one month.
- Try to plan around these pests. Each one has his own personality and taste buds but the groundhogs in particular haven't seemed too interested in my ground covers, large shrubs (forsythia, beauty bush, nandina, spirea), ornamental grasses, dusty miller, small trees (such as dwarf Japanese maple), daylilies, and even daisies.
- They seem to love impatiens, coleus, pansies, and small roses are apparently very attractive to them.
- A lot of trouble but something you may want to consider is putting your annuals in pots or planters, even window boxes that are either out of reach or can be moved to a deck or garage at night for protection.
- If you don't have people walking your garden (up too close), want low maintenance, and a long beautiful season of color there is always the craft store in the Wegman's shopping center. They have a gorgeous array of silk and plastic that will carry you through a season or two.
- Some various home remedies include mothballs, Epsom salts, and ammonia-soaked rags. Each of these fades with time, so repeated application is required. We hear that snakes don't like the moth balls either.
- Groundhogs are basically timid creatures and they don't like motion. Pinwheels can scare them away, or anything that flaps and moves. Low-wattage flashing lights or a motion-activated (timed) sprinkler could work.
 - Wire mesh fencing is a consideration but you need to



insure compliance with community regulations and follow specific directions available online, as groundhogs can burrow under or climb over regular fence installations.

• Naturally nature will take its course. There are predators in Lake Manassas and groundhogs also can fall prey to our pets. I have a pug who seems to dare "our" groundhog. My pug will stand with his front paws on the windowsill locking eyes with the groundhog and they will stay like that for several min-

utes. It's rather funny when we are all inside but I would not want to see what would happen if there was a confrontation.

• Finally enjoy your grounds and this breathtaking community. Our gardens are under constant threat from insects, deer, drought, flooding, and passing pets!! It is wise to plan your garden budget with replacement in mind and keep your cool.





For Your Consideration -Tips on Being a Good Witness

Crimes are frequently solved by a partnership between the community and its law enforcement agency. Without this vital link, crimes may go unreported or even unsolved. The VA State Police and Prince William County Police Office rely on the community to report suspicious activity, crimes in progress, or crimes that have just occurred. There are many times people will observe suspicious activity and not report it. This is mostly because people do not want to "bother" the Police or are worried about what people may think if it turns out to be "nothing." In actuality even nothing is something. It will bring a Police presence to the community so

others will know that someone is "watching" the community. The Police would like to encourage active participation in helping keep Lake Manassas safe by calling 911 at the first sign of suspicious activity and by being a good witness.

A good witness is someone who can remember the details, such as:

- Height and Weight,
- Hair Color and Style
- and clothing of a suspect.

If a vehicle is involved, a good witness would remember:

A license plate

- Color, Make and Model,
- Any identifying marks, and
- Direction of travel.

A good witness would probably carry a pen and some paper so that as something happens they could write it down. The longer that you wait the more information you may forget. Most importantly, a good witness is a safe witness.

If a crime does occur please do not try to get involved. Call 911, and write down what you observed as soon as possible. Even if you suspect something is going on, CALL.

Garage Doors


The Sheriff reports a number of incidents where thieves are simply entering open garages and stealing items from vehicles and homes. Open garage doors are a nightly occurrence for the Sheriff's Office. The patrol deputies routinely see open garages and in many cases attempt to contact the homeowner to make them aware of the situation. This behavior puts both property and family at risk since many

residents do not lock the interior door to the garage since they assume the garage door is closed. In some cases thieves have entered homes and stolen items right from the kitchen counter as residents watched TV or slept inside the home. Citizens sometimes do not take expensive items out of, or even lock their vehicles if the vehicles are parked in a garage. This places both the contents and the vehicle at risk. Kids are also entering garages for the sole purpose of stealing alcohol from refrigerators in

garages. Remember if you have a "beer fridge" it is your responsibility to keep it secured! Be sure to check your garage door is down before heading off to bed or before it gets dark.

Just a reminder that if you have to leave a car in your driveway over night remove all valuables which includes (but is not limited to) items such as laptops, purses, wallets, iPods, and GPS's and LOCK YOUR CAR DOORS!!
